Title VI Program Statement

Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 prohibits discrimination on the basis of race, color, or national origin in programs and activities receiving federal financial assistance. Specifically, Title VI provides that “no person in the United States shall, on the ground of race, color, or national origin, be excluded from participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be subjected to discrimination under any program or activity receiving federal financial assistance (42 U.S.C Section 2000(d)).

Title VI Policy


It is the policy of the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Human Rights Commission to uphold and ensure full compliance with the non-discrimination requirements of Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 and related non-discrimination authorities. These authorities require that no person in the United States of America shall be excluded from participation in, be denied the benefits of, or otherwise be subjected to discrimination under any program or activity receiving federal financial assistance on the basis of race, color, national origin, religion, sex (including stereotypes as it pertains to sexual orientation and gender identity), age, disability, income level, or limited English proficiency.

Additional Information / Filing of Complaints


Any person who believes that they have been subjected to discrimination on any basis named above, has the right to file a complaint. Complaints must be in writing and submitted to the Title VI Coordinator within 180 days of the alleged discrimination.


In addition, to request or receive additional information regarding the Commission's non-discrimination obligations, including its complaint procedures, contact the Title VI Coordinator.
